Maths

L.O – To compare and represent numbers to 10

Today you will need a collection of toys, some conkers or similar sized object and some Lego bricks

Look at the picture below.



- How many hens are there? How many chicks are there?
- Can you compare any other animals in the picture?
- Are there fewer sheep or fewer lambs?
- Look at the hens and chicks. They take up the same amount of space, does that mean there are the same amount of each? How do you know?

Work your way through the mild, spicy and hot tasks as far as you can.

	Look at the other animals in the 'Discover' picture. Compare these groups using the language of more and fewer . Draw your own comparison picture of 2 different groups of farmyard animals. Remember to line them up to compare just like in the video.
	Use your toys to get into 4 teams of different sizes (4-10 in a team) and name each team, e.g Team A, Team B and so on. Ask your grown up to choose 2 teams for you to compare by lining them up. Which team has more toys? Which team has fewer toys? How many more are in Team C than Team D?
	Take a handful of conkers (or something similar size) and ask someone else at home to do the same. Compare by lining them up just like in the video. Who can hold more conkers? Who can hold fewer conkers? You could do the same activity with Lego bricks.
