




words. Any they are unsure of, place to the side to practise.



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



 <p>Mild</p>	<p>Appropriate for children reading Pink 1a/b school books To read the questions, look for the keywords (those in your teddy books) and circle them. Then draw on the sound buttons before sounding out and blending the words. The first question has had the buttons and words done for you as an example. Adults to say the sounds quickly to help your child blend the words.</p>
 <p>Spicy</p>	<p>Appropriate for children reading Pink 2/Red school books To read the questions, look for the keywords (those in your teddy books) and circle them. Then draw on the sound buttons before sounding out and blending the words. Encourage your child to say the sounds quickly to help blend.</p>
 <p>Hot</p>	<p>Appropriate for children reading yellow and above school books To read the questions, look for the keywords (those in your teddy books) and circle them. Then draw on the sound buttons before sounding out and blending the words. You child should independently say the sounds quickly to help blend. Additional challenge- to write your own yes/no question with a word containing the 'ur' sound.</p>
