This week you will be thinking about animals and their habitats and combine your learning with art. Watch this clip to get you started.

Now, using the resource on the home learning page titled – Animal Habitats – you will think about how different animals are suited to their environment.

As you look through the pictures, think about the features of that habitat;

- Is it warm/cold?
- Is it dry or does it have lots of rain?
- Is it large or is it a microhabitat?
- What would live here?
- How would it survive?

On the last page there are some animals. Think about which animal lives in which of the habitats on the pictures.

Group the animals by the areas or habitat they live in and think about which one they are best suited to.

What would happen if the lion wandered into the shallow water habitat?

What if the little gecko found himself in the artic?

Choose some of animals and **create a habitat** for them.

- You can paint or draw one.
- You could use collage of different papers/textures/ pictures from magazines.



- You could use Lego to create the habitat.



- You could use items from around the home.



- Think of our learning from when we spoke to the zoologist, Lucy.
- Then, add the animals – either printed from the home learning page or drawn/write the names of them or other animals you know that live in that habitat. If you have small world animals that live in that habitat, you could use those.

Think about why those animals live in that habitat. How are they suited to where they live?
