Find living animals around your house and garden. Find out what type of animals they are and what they like to eat.

Make a list of things that are alive, not alive or have never been alive.

Try bird watching from your window or in your garden.

Make a tally chart or graph to show how many of each type of bird you see.

Write a glossary which explains the meaning of the words **predator**, **prey**, **producer** and **consumer**.

Create a food chain with pictures

Draw, paint or make a model of a type of habitat e.g. pond, the snowy Antarctic, a rainforest, garden or even just under a large stone or pot in your garden. Draw or paint the types of living things you may find there. Why do they choose to live there?

Make a booklet of the different plants you find in your garden or on your exercise walk.

Make up a dance that shows different types of animals and the way they move.

Think of an animal from the ocean and imagine how it would need to change if it had to live on land. Can you draw the animal and say how it has changed and why?
