L.O – To use phonic knowledge to write sentences with ‘oa’ words

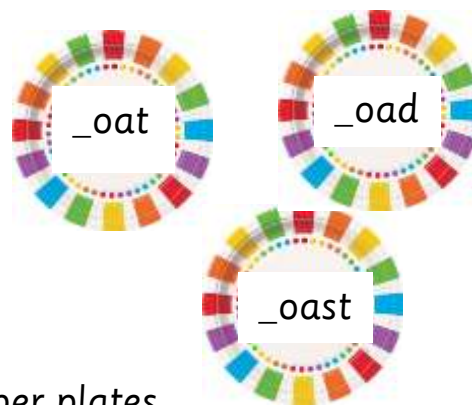
Read Mrs Gregory’s oa word flashcards by following the link below.

 <p>Spicy</p>	Read the ‘oa’ words in the box and talk about what they mean. Copy the sentences underneath adding the correct ‘oa’ word in the spaces. (Sheet attached below)
 <p>Hot</p>	Ask your grown-up to read out one of the sentences for you. Count the number of words in the sentence and place a counter in front of you for each word. Listen to the sentence again and repeat it pointing to each counter as you say each word. Now write the sentence on a line in your book or on lined paper. You will find the 5 sentences on the mild and spicy sheet.
