We'd like you to choose at least three animals and think about their habitat. (You can choose more, if you'd like to).

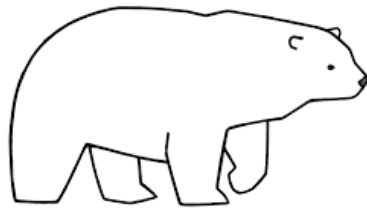
Where does your animal live?

Why does it choose to live there, do you think?

How is it suited to this habitat?

Don't choose pets - think about where your chosen animals live in the wild.

You could present your work like this:



Polar bears live in the Arctic. With their two coats of fur and a thick layer of blubber to help insulate the polar bear's body from the cold, polar bears are well-equipped for survival in a harsh environment. In addition, polar bears' paws are especially adapted for walking on the ice and swimming in the sea. Hairs and bumps on the soles of their feet help them to grip, while webbing between their toes helps them to swim well.

Here are some different habitats which you could choose from:

Desert, forest, ocean, savannah, tropical rainforest, wetlands, polar regions.

You may be able to think of others too.
