SPELLINGS

You can learn your spellings over a few days and then get an adult to see how many you can spell. If you want to email us your score, you can.

This week's focus is 'homophones'.

Homophones are words that sound the same but have a different meaning and are spelled differently.

These are the words we'd like you to learn but you could see how many other homophones you can find.

Make sure you learn the meaning of each homophone!

there	The place - "over there".
they're	Contraction of 'they are'.
their	Something that belongs to them: "That's their cat."
your	Something that belongs to you. "Is that your coat?"
you're	Contraction of 'you are'.
to	Somewhere you are going, e.g. to school, to the shops
too	As well - "Can I play too?"
two	The number (2)
here	The place - "Come over here."
hear	You hear with your ears.

You can practise your words using the 'look, say, cover, write, check' strategy or you can rainbow write them in different colours.
