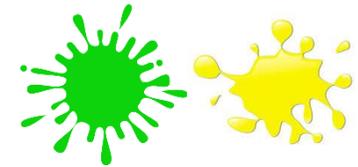




Reception Literacy and Maths Optional Extras

If you would like additional activities to complete at home this week, you may wish to choose some of the below ideas. Any worksheets will also be in this document. These activities are for everyone.

Literacy

- Find out about the planets in our solar system, write about one of them.
- Your alien (from Literacy Task 1) won't know how to do anything on planet Earth. Write a set of instructions to explain to your alien how to do 1 thing from your everyday routine. E.g. brush teeth, bake a cake, make a slice of toast. You may even like to record you explaining and doing your chosen activity.

Mathematics

- Listen to the song '5 little men in a flying saucer'

Write the number sentences to match each part of the song e.g. $5-1=4$. For an extra challenge you could also change the song to use larger numbers e.g. 10 little men in a flying saucer
- Play subtract 4 in a row using the sheet below

Other Areas of Learning

- After listening to Mrs Gregory read 'Aliens love underpants' (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=4uXOx3yMyFM&feature=youtu.be>), design your own pants for the aliens using different materials e.g. paint, collage, fabric.

Dice Subtraction 4 in a row

1	9	7	5
4	6	2	0
3	5	1	8
9	7	3	4

Instructions:

You will need:

- 2 piles of number cards 1-10
- 10 small objects to help work out the subtraction problem.
- Each player will need a set of counters (these will need to be different e.g buttons and raisins)

How to play with your grown up:

1. Take a card from each pile
2. Subtract the smaller number from the bigger number using the small objects to help.
3. Put your counter on the number on the board that matches how many you have left.
4. If your number has a counter on, miss your turn
5. Take it in turns until a player gets 4 in a row or the board fills up.
