

## Teddy Words

**Please complete this activity if you are continuing your learning at home.**

Please add the new teddy words for this week onto your child's 'Sumer term' teddy. Our final teddy words for this year are: 'children' and 'put'

 <p>Mild</p>	<p>Practise writing our new teddy words 'put' and 'children' by using our 'look, cover, write, check' strategy.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Ask your grown up to write the word (this can be on paper, in chalk on the ground, in shaving foam- any way you like!)</li> <li>2. Look really carefully at the word, the letters, their shapes and the order they go in</li> <li>3. Cover the word up and have a go at writing it without looking.</li> <li>4. Uncover the word to check if your spelling matched.</li> </ol> <p>You may also want to write the word and then chop it up into letter cards, muddle them up and see if you can rearrange them to make the teddy word.</p>
 <p>Spicy</p>	<p>Complete the mild challenge and then write the following sentence. Adults, please say the sentence aloud for your child to write. Encourage them to use their sounds.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The children put the toys away.</li> </ol> <p>Once you have written the sentence, highlight/circle the teddy words in it.</p> <p>You may wish to look in your books at home to find sentences with the words 'put' and 'children' in them. Can you copy the ones you find or read them to your grown up?</p>
 <p>Hot</p>	<p>Complete the mild challenge – look, cover, write, check for our new teddy words.</p> <p>Then write the following sentences. Adults, please say the sentence aloud slowly to help your child remember it before they write it using their teddy and phonic knowledge.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Mum asked Kipper to help put the washing away.</li> <li>2. Mum, Gran and the children went on holiday to Scotland.</li> </ol> <p>Once you have written the sentence, highlight/circle the teddy words in it.</p> <p>You may wish to look in your books at home to find sentences with the words 'put' and 'children' in them. Can you copy the ones you find or read them to your grown up?</p>
