Look at the slide below. See if you can answer the questions.

- 🐝 Can you count the items in each picture? Which is different? How do you know?

Which picture is the odd one out?

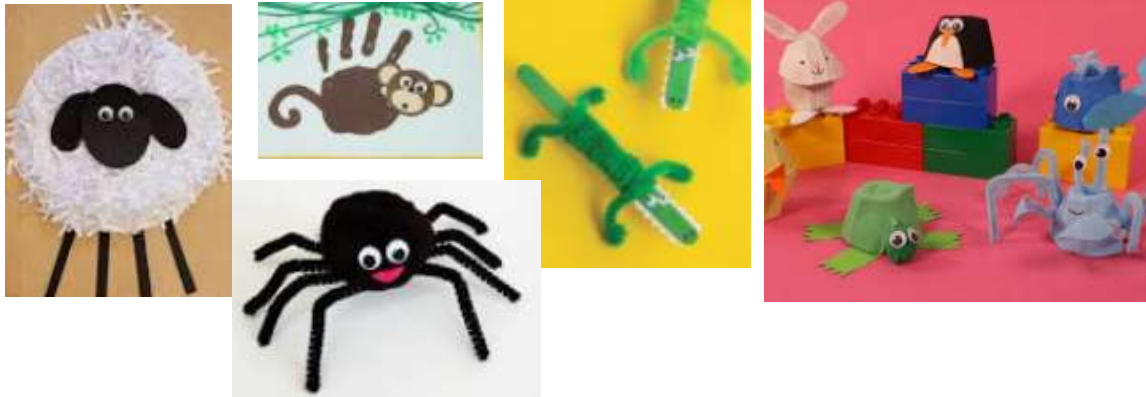
I will count.

- 🐝 Which picture do you think is the odd one out? Why?
- 🐝 Is the ladybird the odd one out? Why?
- 🐝 Could the flowers be the odd one out? Why? [because they are flowers and the other pictures are all animals]
- 🐝 Could any other picture be th eodd one out? Why not?



For the next activity you will need a selection of animals with varying numbers of legs. Maybe you have some toy animals at home or you could make some from pom-poms, paper plates and pipe-cleaners, you could even draw or paint some of your own.



Take a group of up to 8 animals. Which animal is the odd one out?

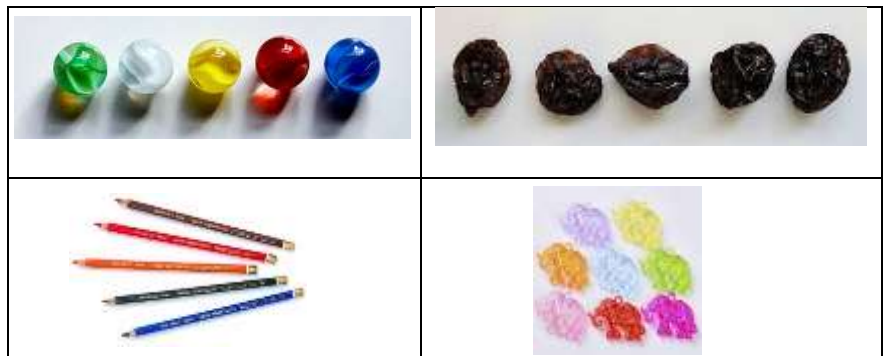
Touch each leg as you count to see how many legs each animal has. Start with a different number of animals and find the odd one out this time.



Take a piece of paper split into 4 sections like this to create your own odd one out game. Collect

items from around the house to put in each section. You could use toy animals, pencils, crayons, counters etc to represent numbers up to 8. Tell your grown up which is the odd one out and why.

Maybe you could play with a partner and swap boards to find the odd one out.
